

What is Sora


Sora is an innovative, online, private middle and high school that flips the script on the traditional one-size-fits-all education system. At Sora, our mission is to empower students to thrive through an education as unique as they are. Sora revolves around a student-led curriculum where students choose their own path based on their interests and goals, all the while gaining a valuable education that better prepares them for college, a career, or wherever their future may take them.

Sora's middle and high school is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, which allows us to meet the requirements of all 50 states and colleges and universities. The high school has a secondary accreditation with Cognia, which is widely recognized both within the U.S. and internationally. Additionally, our program is approved by the NCAA which provides students the ability to play collegiate sports.

Our unparalleled curriculum puts students in charge of their education. Utilizing our proprietary software with over 400 interest-based classes and a mastery-based assessment system that rewards trial and error, our students fall in love with the world we share while developing essential 21st-century skills. Sora's Key Concepts

Here are **four key concepts** that are the foundation of Sora's unique learning model:

1. Inquiry-Based Learning

Inquiry-based learning empowers students to ask questions and investigate real-world problems. At Sora, we believe education should inspire students to be curious about the world we share, so we prioritize curriculum content that is more practical and applicable to our students' lives and futures. Inquiry-based learning directly answers the most common question in any school: "Why do I need to learn this?"



2. Student-Led Learning Path

Students are happier and more engaged in school when they own their journey and choose how they demonstrate their learning, but that isn't how most traditional schools work. So, at Sora, we do it differently. We've created a curriculum that allows for each student to have a much more significant say in what and how they learn.

We still teach all the "must-have" lessons at Sora, but students get to choose from an extremely diverse and creative selection of course content, and there are a number of ways to achieve their learning goals. We work with our students as they build independence, motivation, and autonomy and progressively introduce more responsibility as they move through our program.

3. Teachers as Guides

Our faculty work side by side with students like performance coaches, helping them to grow and deepen their understanding and mastery. From daily standups (Sora's version of "homeroom") and coaching sessions, to community-wide learning roundtables, Sora elegantly couples freedom with just-in-time support from faculty.



4. Mindset Over Memorization

At Sora, we believe the attitudes and thought patterns that students hold matter just as much as the content they encounter. So, we've designed Sora to cultivate seven "Mindsets": Growth Mindset, Meaning Making, Agency, Curiosity, Positive-sum Thinking, Metacognition, and Connection Seeking.



Sora's Curriculum Explained

Sora students learn through three different types of experiences that teach students integral and relevant lessons based on their interests and goals.

1. Expeditions


Expeditions are Sora's version of "classes" at traditional schools. Expeditions are group learning experiences focused on students' topics of interest, where they apply their knowledge and skills to real-world questions and problems.

2. Activities

Activities are individual, asynchronous learning experiences that allow students to deepen their mastery of concepts and abilities and earn credit toward graduation.

3. Independent Study Projects

Independent Study Projects (ISPs) are student-designed learning experiences developed in partnership with faculty and undertaken independently.

The Sora Way

Sora students aren't evaluated through traditional tests or quizzes and they don't get letter grades. Instead, at the end of a learning experience, Sora students are awarded a zero to four score on each "Unit" and "Ability" based on their demonstrated mastery of the material. Crucially, scores are not final until graduation, so students can always try again. This way, students can "overwrite" poor performances and practice a growth mindset. Each student determines their own path through the curriculum, in partnership with their advisor. Using our cutting edge technology, students maximize their opportunity to follow their interests and passions, while deepening mastery and building a diverse and holistic portfolio of learning. By graduation, students proudly share an accredited Sora transcript with a mastery GPA with college and employers. Students also have dual-enrollment opportunities while in Sora High School.
